



Yet in crossing and re-crossing the US-Mexican border, this novel reveals a singular ambition. It probes, with only partial success, the source of the vexed historical relationship between art and politics in the United States, as well as the gap between a life lived and a life reported. We meet at 6.00pm to enjoy the excellent Rajdhaani cuisine and the discussion about the book commences at 7.30pm over a drink for about an hour.
